

Psalme. XCIX. C.

- 8 And let the clouds reioyce their fils; and clap their handes apace:
And eke the mountaines and the hills, before the Lord his face.
9 For he shall come to iudge and try, the world and every wight:
And rule the people mightely, with justice and with right.

Dominus regnabit. Psalme. xcix. I.H.

Che commandeth the power, equity, and credence of the kingdome of God by Christ, ouer the Jew and Gentile, and commandeth them to magnify the name, and to serue the Lord, following the example of the auncient fathers, Moses, Aaron, and Samuel, who calling upon God were heard in their prayers.

Sing this as the xcv. Psalme.

- + Oh enter thē his gates w praise, approach w ioy his courtes unto:
Praise, laud, and blesse his name alwayes, for it is semely so to do.
For why: the Lord our God is good, his mercy is for euer sure:
his truth at all times firmly stooode, and shal fro age to age endure.

Sing this as the lxvij. Psalme.

- 1 God the Lord be glad & light, praise him throughout the earth:
Serue him & come before his light, With singing and With mirth.
2 Know that the Lord our God he is, he did vs make and keepe.
Not we our selues, for we are his owne folke and pasture sheepe.
3 O go into his gates alwayes, geue thankes Within the same:
Within his courtes set forth his prayse, and laud his holy name.

Misericordiam & iudicium. Psalme. C. N.

Christ describeth what government he will obserue in his house and kingdome. He will punish and correct by rooting out the wicked, and cherishing the godly persons.

Sing this as the viii. Psalme.

- M**ercy will and iudgement sing, O Lord God unto thee:
And wisely do in perfect way, vntill thou come to mee.
2 And in þ midst of my house walke, in purenes of my sprite:
3 And I no kinde of wicked thing, wil set before my sight.

- I hate their worke that fall away, it shall not cleave to me:
4 From me shall part the froward hart, none emill will I see.
him will I stroy that flaundereth, his neighbour priuily:

Cit semeth that this prayer was appointed to the faithfull to pray in the captiuitie of Babilon. A consolacion for the building of the Church: Wherof foloweth the prayse of God to be published unto all posterities. The conuersion of the Gentiles: And the stabilitie of the Church.

Sing this as the 67. Psalme.

2 In time of trouble do not hide, thy face away from mee.
