

## 71. Plalme Xcix. C. Ci.


The commandeth the power, equity, & excellency of the

is holy encre stille.



my crye come unto thee:  
2 In time of trouble do not hide,  
thy face away from mee.  
3 Incline thine eares to me, make hast  
to heare me when I call:  
For as the smoke doth fade, so do  
my dayes consume and fall.  
4 And as a heath my bones are burnt,  
my hart is limitten dead:  
And wthers as the graffe, that I  
forget to eate my bread.  
5 For reason of my grovning boyce,  
my bones cleave to my laine:  
6 As pelican in wildernes,  
such case now am I in.

And as an owle in desert is,  
Ioe I am such a one:  
7 I watch and as a Sparrow on,  
the house top am alone.  
8 Loe dayly in reprochfull wise,  
myne enemis do me scorne:  
And they that do againt me rage,  
against me they haue swoone.

And mingled haue my drinke with teares,

16 Then when the Lord the mighty God,  
agayne shall Sion reare:  
And then when he most nobly in

17 To prayer of the desolate,

Wher he shall not disdaigne unto,  
their prayers to attend.  
18 This shalbe wriuen for the age,
